**COMMITTEE MEETING 9<sup>TH</sup> JULY 2010**  
**MINUTES**

**Minutes:** The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

**1. MATTERS ARISING:**

**a. The Open Tournament.** There were plenty of entries, though numbers were slightly down on last year. It was a very good day, much enjoyed by everyone, and a profit of just over £240 was made.

**b. Forecast Rounds.** A notice about adhering to these where possible is up in the pavilion.

**c. The June Taster.** Another very good day. Several members came to help and ten people turned up to shoot, of which one has joined the Club, two more are on the list for the October beginners, and others are interested if they can fit in with the course (see Sarah's remarks in Any Other Business, below).

It was agreed that the next Taster will be held on 31<sup>st</sup> July, with the later start time of 11 am. Diane will buy supplies for the barbecue.

**d. The Mullion Have A Go** was also a success, with Carol, Trystan and Alison busy all day. People took details of the club and beginners' course, but there were no firm takers. Carol had a very nice phone call from the Headmaster thanking us, and she felt it had been a good PR exercise.

Adrian suggested that we should print some cards with the Club's website and details of someone to contact, which could be handed out on such occasions. Trystan offered to undertake this.

### 4. EQUIPMENT OFFICER'S REPORT

Tony has checked the Club bows and found that some are missing: D3, a left-handed bow, and C1. Also two of the new junior right-handed bows, E8 and E9. It was agreed that after the next beginners' course a list should be maintained of who is using which bow.

## **5. AMENITIES.**

Hugh has everything under control. Jon asked about treating the pavilion. Hugh has it in hand and will let us know when he needs volunteers. It was agreed that this should be on the agenda for discussion next time.

## **6. COACHING**

Adrian said he had been approached by some members about the possibility of extra coaching. It was agreed that it was hard on the senior archers to give up shooting times during the summer, after the beginners' classes indoors. It was then suggested that one senior archer should be available for coaching on Friday evenings during the summer, which would work out roughly as giving up one session every five or six weeks. Diane will put up a notice in the pavilion, and also bring this to everyone's attention in the newsletter, together with reminders about line etiquette and members being on time for sessions.

## **7. ANY OTHER BUSINESS**

**Nigel** said that recently some members had taken a foam target up the field and on returning it had knocked down the cable across the sheds at the back, and had said nothing about it. This was unfair on Hugh, who had to put it up again. Everyone has mishaps sometimes, but it is the responsibility of the person who caused the mishap to help put it right.

**Jackie** said that she would not be standing for re-election to the Committee. Carol thanked Jackie for her long service to the Club as Records Officer, and asked if she would be prepared to help the new Records Officer, to which Jackie agreed. It was then suggested that Sue Jennings be asked if she would consent to be co-opted on to the Committee before the AGM, and this was agreed.

**Diane** said that she could not continue to edit the newsletter, owing to pressure of time, and in any case felt that it was time for someone else to take over. Adrian very kindly offered to do the printing of the July newsletter, which will be Diane's last. Carol thanked Diane for doing a good job.

**Sarah** said that her friends who had come to the June Taster had immensely enjoyed themselves, and would like to join the beginners' course if this is held on a Friday, as they are committed elsewhere on Mondays.

**Adrian** asked how the Tasters were advertised. Diane said she advertised in the local papers and on Pirate FM, and in Tesco (though they failed to put up the notice last time) and would welcome any other suggestions. It was agreed that flyers could be distributed in local shops, and that the cost of a Taster session should be displayed on the notice. Diane will email copies of the notice to Committee members.

**Adrian** has kindly donated a trophy, for wooden arrows only, to be won at the Indoor Tournament. He also offered to put up more lights in the pavilion.

**Adrian** also asked if the date of the Christmas dinner could be fixed. He hoped to be back in time for Christmas this year. Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> December was agreed, and the Committee was asked to think of venues and suggest them at the next meeting.

It was agreed that the August Taster should be held on Saturday 21 August in order not to clash with the Bank Holiday.
